

## Tournament Regulations

- We play according to NEVOBO rules.
- We apply the rally system; the player who reaches 25 points first, with a difference of at least two points, wins the set.
- There is **no libero**.
- If any part of the **foot extends over the line under the net**, we will call a stop due to the risk of injury!
- Players who have played in the NEVOBO competition after **December 31, 2024**, are not allowed to play in the Spring Tournament.
- Playing with five players is permitted only in exceptional circumstances and after notification to the tournament management.
- A maximum of three women may play in men's teams. No men may play in women's teams.
- Matches consist of three sets; one hour is available for this, including ten minutes of warm-up time.
- The **women's teams from Pool 1** play against 4 opponents in the preliminary rounds, and on the final evening, both the top four and the bottom four teams play inter-team final matches.
- The **women's teams from Pool 2** play against each other in the preliminary rounds. On the final evening, a semi-final and the final matches are played.
- The **men's teams from Pool 1** play against all 5 opponents in the pool. On the final evening, the last matches are played and the final ranking is determined.
- The **men's teams from Pool 2** play a round-robin format for the first four matches. On the final evening, the 1st and 2nd place teams play a final match. The bottom three teams in the standings play a short single round-robin competition on the final evening for places 3 through 5.
- The **men's (mixed) teams from Pool 3** play against 4 opponents in the preliminary rounds, and on the final evening, both the top four and the bottom four teams play final matches against each other.
- Two points are awarded for every set won. One point is awarded for unplayed sets or sets that ended in a tie at the time signal. An unfinished set is won by the team that has a points advantage at the time signal.
- In the event of a tie in the pool or preliminary round, the set quotient determines the order, followed by the head-to-head match and then a draw.

- Each team must be present at the indicated time. Arriving late will be penalized with one point per minute started.
- **Each team must bring their own balls for the warm-up and a match ball (please mark balls).**
- Warming up during other matches is not permitted.
- There is no coin toss; the first-named team (on the match form) has the serve, the other team the choice of court.
- There is no coin toss for the third set, and teams do not switch sides halfway through this set.
- In the last five minutes (indicated by the match officials), no time-outs or substitutions are allowed.
- The end of the available time is indicated by a clear signal. The match ends immediately at that point (do not play out the rally).
- The schedule specifies which team is responsible for refereeing a match. This team also provides a scorekeeper. The referee collects the match form from the tournament management in a timely manner and returns it after the match.
- Women's teams primarily referee women's matches. If women referee men (and vice versa), this is indicated under "refereeing/scoring" as **red text on a yellow background** for the pool matches and on subsequent "refereeing/scoring" pages.
- The referees' decisions are binding.
- **To prevent incorrectly completed match forms, the form must be signed by the referee and both teams after the match.**
- Neither ABC Volleybal nor the tournament management are liable or can be held liable for damage to players or property belonging to players, visitors, and other involved parties, however caused.
- In cases not covered by these regulations, the tournament management will make the decision.
